Child Labour is the practice of having children engage in economic activity, on part or full time basis. The practice deprives children of their childhood, and is harmful to their physical and mental development. Poverty, lack of good schools and growth of informal economy are considered as the important causes of child labour in India.

India has a federal form of government, and labour being a subject in the Concurrent List, both the central and state governments can and have legislated on child labour. The major national legislative developments include the following:

- The Factories Act of 1948
- The Mines Act of 1952
- The Child Labour (Prohibition and Regulation) Act of 1986
- The Juvenile Justice (Care and Protection) of Children Act of 2000
- The Right of Children to Free and Compulsory Education Act of 2009

In order to create awareness to abolish Child labour, CBSE has assigned a project.
